

Certificate Deactivation / Reactivation Form

Use this form to change which certificate(s) you are maintaining. If you choose to deactivate a certificate, will be publicly reported as 'Not Certified, Lapsed' for that certificate starting the 1st day of April after you deactivate. If you choose to reactivate ABIM will resume billing you for it and you will be reported as Certified as long as all of your Maintenance of Certification (MOC) requires purposes

EFFECTS OF ACTIONS

Deactivation

MOC Requirements &

Deactivating the certificate will change the status of the certificate to "Not Certified, Lapsed." This status change will take place on April 1 following the processing of the deactivation request.

Rilling

Deactivation requests will result in cessation of billing for the following calendar year. The deadline to deactivate a certificate is March 31. If the certificate is deactivated on/before March 31 of the current year, you will not be billed for the current year. If the certificate is deactivated after March 31 of the current year, you will be billed for the current year, but the not the following year. Pre-paid certificate fees for deactivated certifications will be credited to your ABIM account.

Reactivation

MOC Requirements & Status

Reactivating a certificate will restore it to the status it had at the time it was deactivated (i.e., Certified, Not Certified, Lapsed, Suspended). For example, if the certificate status was "Certified" when deactivated, and the MOC assessment date passed while the certificate was deactivated, the certificate status will become "Not Certified, Lapsed" until the assessment requirement is met.

Please note: If the deactivated certificate is eligible for an MOC assessment, you can reactivate it by registering for that assessment. Submitting this form is not necessary under these circumstances.

Billing

Billing for the certificate will resume immediately upon reactivation. The diplomate will be responsible for current year payment of the certificate fee regardless of when the certificate is reactivated in the calendar year.
